Toprevent this from happening, CP supports the Preserving Telehealth, Hospital, and Ambulance Accesse/Aich would extend these flexibilities for two years until the end of 2026. Longer term stability wstweengthen patient care, so we also encourage the Ways and Means Comrtwitteelude legislation in this mark-up, like the CONNECT for Health Act of 2023, 41.89, the Protecting Rural Telehealth Access Act, H.R. 3440, and the Telehealth Modernization Act of 2024, H.R. 7623, which facilitate access to care via telehealthermanently

ACP is the largest medical specialty organization and the second largest physician membership society in the United States. ACP members include0000 internal medicine physicians, related subspecialists, and medical students. Internal medicine physicians are specialists who apply scientific knowledge, clinical expertise, and compassion to the preventive, diagnostic, and

health care team, and reduce medical costs when used as a component of a patient's longitudinal care. Extending the currefinexibilities for at least an additional twoears gives

addition to allowing health centers and rural health clinics to provide telehealth services. ACP supports these bills as well.

Conclusion

We strongly encourage the Committee to support legislation to permanently extend the current telehealth flexibilities in addition to a tory ear extension. Telehealth services are critical to ensuring everyone has access to affordable,-**qigh** ity healthcare especially those who are vulnerable and reside in rural and underserved communities.
