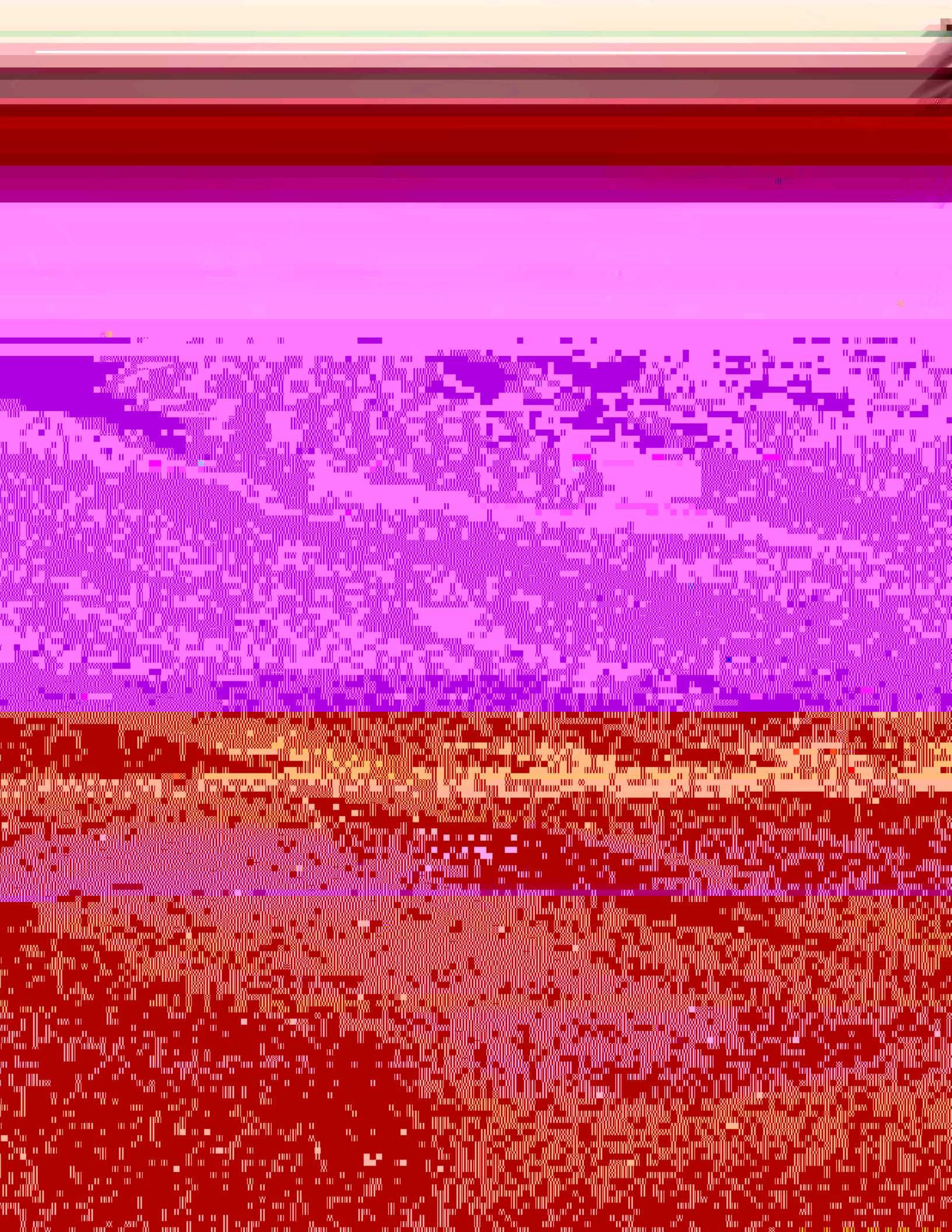

## ACP-Arizona Education Committee

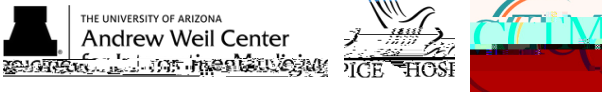
