#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARTICIPATION ACP INDIANA RESIDENT AND MEDICAL STUDENT DAY POSTER COMPETITION

- 1. Abstracts are due on **August 20, 2023. NO LATE ENTRIES**. Abstracts must be prepared as directed and submitted using the online submission link. Abstracts may not be longer than 450 words (not including title or authors). References are included in the 450 word limit.
- 2. Each person may submit no more than one abstract to each category, with a maximum of two total submissions (e.g., one may submit one to Clinical Vignette and one to the Other category, or any other combination of two categories).
- 3. - 4. ACP Indiana will accept 20-26 posters. Abstracts falling into a lower acceptance pool will be accepted as an abstract or e-poster.
- 5. The first author of the abstract must be an ACP member, and a medical student or RFM at an Indiana medical school or internal medicine residency currently enrolled in a program. Faculty cannot serve as first authors for a RFM or medical student abstract as the primary purpose of this activity is to showcase resident/student scholarly activity.
- 6. Original abstracts that either have or have not been presented at other meetings (including ACP chapters/Regions) will be considered. Abstracts previously submitted to the National Meeting are not eligible and are subject to disqualification.
- 7. Presentation of original work at the ACP meeting may, however, jeopardize presentation before another society. Abstracts are eligible if they have been published; however, the resident should notify the journal that the material is being presented at the ACP Chapter meeting.

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR PARTICIPATION ACP INDIANA RESIDENT AND MEDICAL STUDENT DAY ORAL CLINICAL VIGNETTE COMPETITION

- 1. Participants must be ACP Indiana members in good standing.
- 2. Oral Clinical Vignette Abstract may NOT be used for the Poster Presentation Abstract.
- 3. **Two** residents from each of the Indiana Internal Medicine residency programs will be selected by their program to present an **oral clinical vignette.** Presenters must be PGY-2 or PGY-3
- 4. **ACP Definition:** A clinical vignette is a report of one or more cases that illustrates a new disease entity, or a prominent or unusual clinical feature of an established disease. It may include a summary of pertinent patient history, physical findings, laboratory data, or management description.
- Oral Vignette abstract submissions are due on <u>September 8, 2023.</u> NO LATE ENTRIES. Abstracts must be prepared as directed and submitted to <u>colleenkeekuacp@gmail.com</u> in a Word Document. Abstracts may not exceed 450 words.
- 6. Oral Vignette cases may NOT be presented as posters at the same meeting.
- 7. Vignettes may be <u>up to five minutes</u> in length, and may be followed by up to an additional three minutes for audience questions (total presentation and discussion= 8 minutes).
